The History of the Knott's Family

Wiley and Binna Knott's parents were brought to America as slaves before 1840 to the state of Pennsylvania. It is not known how they became indentured servants on the Knott's Berry Farm in that state nor how many children they had. As in most cases during the slavery era slaves were given the same name as the family whose land they lived and worked on.

Nevertheless, it is known that Wiley and Binna were married in 1840 and sometime after their union migrated to Alabama by way of the river and settled in a place located near Uriah at Bowden Landing. The land they settled on was owned by a white family known as English.

They titled the land as sharecrosspers and raised sixteen children listed as follows:
